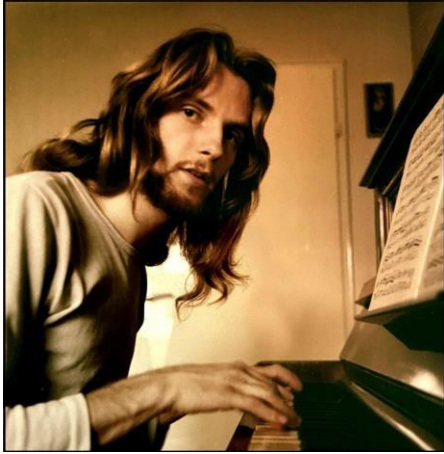


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Ulrich Kutschera: ‘Creativity and Authenticity are the keys to success’



This report is based on an interview with the scientist, composer and author.

Ulrich Kutschera, a renowned biologist and musician, was born in Freiburg, i. Br., Germany. His father, a talented artist and photographer, and his mother, a classical piano player instilled in him a love for music and the arts from an early age. Ulrich began playing classical piano at age 9 and soon started composing his own music, inspired by the masters of classical music such as Bach, Mozart and Beethoven.

As a young man, Kutschera pursued a career in biology, earning a Master's degree and Ph.D. in evolutionary biology and physiology. Kutschera's latest project was a unique re-composition of Bedrich Smetana's iconic "The Moldau," celebrating the composer's 200th birthday. His next album-vol. 7-2025 will feature new compositions, based on melodies of Smetana and Ludwig van Beethoven, whom he greatly admires: see his Nov.-2024-Single "Beethoven-Joy-Phantasy".

As an independent musician, Kutschera's goal is not mainstream success but rather to share his music with like-minded individuals. He is honoured that his music has resonated with members of the US and UK communities, featuring on Spotify-playlists, like "Ludwig van Beethoven Inspired" and "Meditative Mind".

Kutschera's journey as a scientist and musician has been marked by a passion for discovery and creativity. He continues to inspire as a professor of biology, researcher, and artist, leaving a lasting legacy in both the scientific and musical communities.

In addition to his music and scientific pursuits, Kutschera is also a prolific author, having written hundreds of research papers and 17 books on various topics, including biology, music, and philosophy. His writing reflects his curiosity and love for learning, as well as his desire to share knowledge with others.
